

The Book of Ruth – Boaz a Type of Redeemer

The Book of Ruth tells the story of Ruth and her mother-in-law Naomi. After Naomi's husband and her two sons die, Naomi returns to her native land accompanied by Ruth, her daughter-in-law, where she is redeemed from poverty and widowhood by her goel (redeemer), Boaz. And through Ruth, Boaz produces a seed and a name for Ruth's dead husband, according to Deuteronomy 25:5, 6.

And Christ Our Savior – Redeemer fulfilled these 5 Roles.
